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4-H Summer Fun is a special program sponsored by Mitchell County 4-H through the NC Cooperative Extension. Activities are open to all youth ages 5-18. Workshops are designed for specific age groups and there are limited spaces. We invite you to join us for a fun and exciting time. You do not have to be a current 4-H member to participate.

To Enroll in 4-H Summer Fun, you must be enrolled in 4-H Online. If you have never been enrolled go to https://nc.4honline.com and set up a profile using these instructions:

SETTING UP A PROFILE

- 1. If you need to create a family, select "I need to setup a profile", complete the fields required and click Create Login.
- 2. Follow the instructions on the on the Family information page and click Continue. Set up only one (1) Family Profile Per Household!

After adding the family, add your family members to that family profile. Use the following to determine the type of membership to add:

- Adult: 4-H Volunteers
- Youth: 4-H Youth between the ages of 8 and 19 who are involved in a 4-H program

IMPORTANT! Adult record should only belong to adult volunteers. For adults and youth, the next pages are authorization releases and health forms for risk management. These are important to have completed in case you get injured during 4-H Summer Fun.

UPDATING A 4-H ONLINE Profile For Youth Who Were Enrolled in 2018

- 4-H members and volunteers must enroll in 4-H annually.
- Go to the 4HOnline login screen
- Login to your family account
- Review and update the information for each youth member and /or yourself
 - Click on the "Edit Tab" to access the youth / volunteer personal information and click Enroll for

current 4-H year.

- Continue through the profile and make any necessary changes.
- When you've made all the necessary updates-Click "submit enrollment."

To find out if your family is eligible please bring verification of income from the past year or 90 days from June 6th. This can be in the form of pay stubs, print out, social security award letter, or personal statement. No bank statements will be accepted, however. If you are a current 4-H member you may bring these on our June 6th registration day between 8am and 5:00pm. For general public applicants please bring your information on June 7th between 8am and 5:00pm. WAMY representatives will be available during these times at the Mitchell County Cooperative Extension Center for your convenience.

No registration for Summer Fun will be accepted over the telephone. Light snack and water will be provided at each workshop. Participants will need to bring a bag lunch to all events requesting such. All events and field trips will continue rain or shine.


